An allergy response kit should contain at least two doses of epinephrine, other medications as noted by the child's physician, and a copy of the Allergy Action Plan.

A kit must accompany the child if he/she is off school grounds (ie: field trip)


## Please circle the type of kit child has at child care.

### EpiPen Auto-Injector and EpiPen Jr Auto-Injector

- Remove the EpiPen Auto-Injector from plastic carrying case.
- · Pull off the blue safety release cap.



- Hold orange tip near outer thigh (always apply to thigh)
- Swing and firmly push orange tip against outer thigh.
- Hold on thigh for approximately 10 seconds.
- Remove the EpiPen Auto-Injector and massage the area for 10 more seconds.



#### Twinject 0.3 and Twinject 0.15

· Remove caps labeled "1" and "2".



- Place rounded tip against outer thigh, press down hard until needle penetrates.
- · Hold for 10 seconds, then remove.

Second Dose Administration
If symptoms don't improve after 10 minutes, administer second dose.

- Unscrew rounded tip. Pull syringe from barrel by holding blue collar at needle base.
- · Slide yellow collar off plunger.
- Put needle into thigh through skin, push plunger down all the way, and remove.





#### Adrenaclick 0.3 and Adrenaclick 0.15

Remove GREY caps labeled "1" and "2".




- Place RED rounded tip against outer thigh.
- Press down hard until needle penetrates Hold for 10 seconds, then remove.



## Auvi-Q 0.3 and Auvi-Q 0.15

- Pull Auvi-Q from the outer case.
   NOTE: Do not proceed to next step until your are ready to use Auvi-Q. If not ready to use, replace the outer case.
- Pull off Red safety guard. To avoid an accidental injection, never touch the black base of the auto-injector. If an accidental injection dose occurs, seek medical help immediately.
   NOTE: The safely guard is meant to be tight. Pull firmly to remove.



 Place black end against the middle of the outer thigh (through clothing, if necessary), then press firmly and hold in place for 5 seconds.
 Each device is a



single-use injection. Only inject into the middle thigh (upper leg). Do not inject into any other location.

Note: Auvi-Q makes a distinct sound (click and hiss) when activated. This is normal and indicates Auvi-Q is working correctly. Do not pull Auvi-Q away from your leg when you hear the click and hiss sound.
